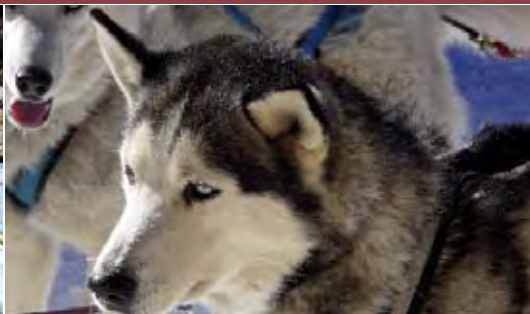

If confirmation is possible, a US \$50 per person non-refundable service charge and additional airline costs incurred will be assessed. A service charge will be assessed for each additional request that is confirmed. Confirmed requests to fly in early or fly out late forfeit the associated airport transfer and any complimentary hotel overnights.

Luggage: Luggage allowance is governed by airline regulations. Excess baggage charges are the responsibility of the passenger. We assume no responsibility for loss, damage, or delay while luggage is in the custody of airlines.

Reservations: Travel agencies provide valuable service and counseling to prospective travelers. We encourage you to make your Gray Line of Alaska reservations with a travel agency with whom you have the confidence of understanding your individual needs. Since space available on tours is limited, reservations should be made as early as possible. Travel agencies are not owned or controlled by Gray Line of Alaska. Your deposits and payments for Gray Line of Alaska services are to be paid to your travel agency with whom you make your reservation. Travel documents will be issued only if and when full payment has been received by Gray Line of Alaska from the travel agency. Refunds for cancelled or unused services will normally be made to the same travel agency on the basis of the amount actually received by Gray Line of Alaska less any applicable cancellation fees and charges. You are responsible for obtaining from your travel agency monies either retained by the agency or received by the agency from Gray Line of Alaska. For further information, please visit our website at www.graylineofalaska.com.

Deposit & Final Payment: A deposit of US \$250 per person, or 50% of the gross tour price if the gross tour price is less than US \$500 per person, is due within 5 days of booking in order to hold your reservation. Final payment is due no later than 60 days prior to departure. Cancellation Protection Plan, if desired, must be paid for at time of deposit. Payment by VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Discover Card or agency check is accepted. For faster processing, the travel agent should include a customer number on the agency check. Travel agents please note that MCOs will not be accepted.

Travel Documents: All tour participants will receive a Contract of Carriage and travel vouchers. A Fly and Tour Air Information card will be provided if you take advantage of our air program. Travel documents are only issued after Gray Line of Alaska has received full payment. Services are not provided for passengers without travel vouchers so please be sure to obtain your documentation packet before leaving home. Assuming that full payment has been received, your documents will be sent out approximately 30 days prior to departure.

Cancellation Policy: A full refund, except for amounts paid for the Cancellation Protection Plan, will be made for written cancellations received by Gray Line of Alaska at least 61 days prior to the date on which you are to commence travel (by air, rail, sea or otherwise). Passengers who cancel after that date for any reason, including medical or family reasons, are subject to the following cancellation fees: 60-46 days before commencing travel - \$250.00 per person or the amount of deposit if the deposit is less than \$250.00 per person; 45-31 days before commencing travel - 50% of gross fare; 30 days or less before commencing travel - 100% of gross fare. Fees incurred as a result of cancellation cannot be applied to future bookings. Travel agents may impose their own cancellation fees. Agency fees of any nature are a matter to be decided on solely by the agency and passengers. Given that the resale of cancelled space on a tour will likely result in a lost opportunity to sell space on other tours, these fees are due regardless of resale. Travel documents are non transferable. Name changes and departure date changes on any portion of your booking are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to cancellation fees.

Late Reservations: For reservations requested 30 days or less before departure, we must have a customer's credit card information so that payment can be effected once the space is confirmed. A \$25 administrative fee will be charged on all late reservations. If the reservation is cancelled after acceptance of confirmation our cancellation policies apply.

Medical Services: Medical services may be limited given the remote areas in which some tours operate. If your condition requires that you have a special medical apparatus or assistance during your tour, we must be made aware of that at time of booking in order to determine whether we can accommodate your needs. If you are using prescription drugs, please bring an adequate supply with you and keep them in your carry-on luggage.

Immigration & Customs: For U.S. and Canadian citizens, you may be required to have a valid passport in your possession to enter or re-enter the United States. We strongly recommend carrying a passport that is valid for at least six months beyond the completion date of your travel. For more information, please visit www.travel.state.gov/passport or www.passportcanada.gc.ca.

U.S. citizens may check with the U.S. Department of State for passport requirements of each country in their itineraries. Non-U.S. citizens should check with the Embassy or Consulate of each country in the itinerary for passport requirements.

For non-U.S. citizens, you must be in possession of a valid passport and any necessary visas. In addition, non-U.S. citizens who have previously been admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence and who will be returning to the U.S., no reentry permit is required, but you must carry your passport and your Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551), commonly known as a Green Card. Resident aliens not in possession of this must obtain one at the nearest office of the U.S. Immigration Service. For more information, please check with the applicable Embassy or Consulate for passport and visa requirements.

If you have been a convicted of a felony, you will not be permitted to enter Canada. In order to avoid

problems when reentering the United States, we strongly recommend that U.S. residents register their valuables with U.S. Customs before departure. You must do this at a Customs office near your home. Items that should be registered generally include those not manufactured in the United States. Customs pays particular attention to cameras (including special lenses and video equipment), binoculars, radios, foreign-made watches and appliances.

Passengers with Disabilities: Gray Line of Alaska does not discriminate against persons on the basis of disability. We seek, to the extent feasible, to accommodate the needs of persons with disabilities so you are able to enjoy our tours. You need to be aware, however, that certain tour facilities may not be fully accessible to wheelchair passengers. Although Gray Line of Alaska endeavors to make sure that other persons or companies providing services or portions of the tour satisfy their obligations under applicable law, Gray Line of Alaska cannot guarantee that all of those services or portions will be fully accessible to a person with disabilities. Service animals are permitted if prior arrangements have been made at time of booking. In limited situations where an individual with a disability would be unable to satisfy certain specified safety and other criteria, even when provided with appropriate auxiliary aids and services, we may find it necessary to ask the individual to make alternative travel arrangements. It is essential that we be notified of any special medical, physical or other requirements you may have at the time of booking. Changes in Tour Content: Gray Line of Alaska reserves the right to alter the tours listed in this brochure and, if necessary, substitute a tour component of comparable value (including hotels of a similar category).

Pets: Animals or pets are not allowed with the exception of qualified service animals for disabled passengers. Please notify your travel agent at time of booking if you intend to bring a service animal.

Change Charges: Changing your itinerary after reservations have been made can result in loss of advantages gained by early planning. To cover administrative costs, a per-person charge will be made if you request a change in your travel arrangements after the final payment due date for your tour. Change charges are not assessed for the addition of services unless travel documents must be reissued.

Refund Policy: Gray Line of Alaska reserves the right to cancel all or part of the tour in its reasonable discretion including in response to insufficient sales. If Gray Line of Alaska cancels the entire tour, you will receive a full refund of amounts paid to Gray Line of Alaska. If Gray Line of Alaska cancels a portion of the tour due to weather or other reasons beyond the control of Gray Line of Alaska or if you decide, for any reason whatsoever, to not participate in all or part of the tour, Gray Line of Alaska will not be required to make any refunds. For other partial cancellations by Gray Line of Alaska, you will receive a refund for the value of the cancelled portion, with value to be determined by Gray Line of Alaska in a fair and equitable manner. If, due to weather or other unforeseen reasons, flights are adversely impacted or you

are required to spend an additional night in a location, hotel and meal costs and other incidental expenses are your responsibility. All refunds will be made through the travel agent used for the booking on the basis of the amount actually received by Gray Line of Alaska less any applicable cancellation fees and charges. You are responsible for obtaining from your travel agency monies either retained by the agency or received by the agency from Gray Line of Alaska.

Luggage Policy: Two pieces of stored luggage per person are allowed. All luggage must be able to fit in the baggage compartment of Gray Line of Alaska motor coaches. Gray Line of Alaska will carry as baggage only your personal effects for your wearing, comfort or convenience during your tour. Your baggage needs to be placed in securely constructed and locked suitcases. During your travel, you should not leave money, jewelry or other valuables left lying in hotels, on buses or elsewhere. Certain hotels may provide either safe deposit boxes or room safes. Your use of safe deposit boxes or similar facilities will not increase Gray Line of Alaska's liability as described below. Gray Line of Alaska can not be responsible for any loss or damage that occurs before baggage comes into Gray Line of Alaska's actual custody when you begin your travel with us or after baggage leaves our actual custody at the end of your travel with us. In particular, please note that Gray Line of Alaska does not assume any responsibility for loss of or damage to or delay of perishable items, medicine, liquor, cash, credit or debit cards, jewelry, gold, silver or similar valuables, securities, financial instruments, records or other valuable or business documents, computers, cellular telephones, cameras, hearing aids, electric wheelchairs, scooters, or other video or electronic equipment, binoculars, film, videotape, computer disks, audio disks, tapes or CD's or any carry-on baggage left unattended on motor coaches or on other modes of transportation or in hotels. If Gray Line of Alaska, due to any cause whatsoever, is liable for loss of, damage to, or delay of your property, the aggregate amount of Gray Line of Alaska's liability will not exceed US \$100 (US \$600 for passengers who have purchased CPP) unless you have specified to Gray Line of Alaska in writing the true value of your property and paid to Gray Line of Alaska before departure 1% of the value in excess of US \$100 or US \$600, as applicable. In that event, Gray Line of Alaska's aggregate liability will be limited to the amounts so specified.

Responsibility: Westours Motor Coaches, Inc., which does business as Gray Line of Alaska, is a wholly owned subsidiary of Holland America Line Inc. The responsibilities and liabilities of Gray Line of Alaska as to the tours are spelled out in the travel documents you will receive. Please read them carefully as soon as you receive them. A copy of the form of carriage contract will be provided upon request. Please note that the contract includes a clause specifying certain courts in the State of Washington as the exclusive forum for resolving disputes. It is important to note that services or portions of the tours provided by any person or company other than Gray Line of Alaska (such as airlines, taxis, shore excursions, hotels, boats or other vessels other than those operated by Gray Line of Alaska, meals and medical care providers) are performed by independent contractors, are solely at your risk and are subject to the terms or arrangements made by you or on your behalf with the independent contractor. Gray Line of Alaska assumes

no responsibility with respect to the goods or services of these independent contractors (including for delay, injury, death or damage to property) even though it may collect monies or make arrangements on your behalf.

Increases In Fares or Taxes: Fares quoted in this brochure are those in effect at the time of printing. If cost factors, including airline costs, dictate the need for fare increases, Gray Line of Alaska may quote the increased fares rather than the fares quoted in this brochure at any time prior to departure to those passengers who have either not yet booked or paid the booking in full. Passengers who have not yet paid their bookings in full can cancel (without paying a cancellation fee) rather than accept a fare increase. The term "Taxes" as used by Gray Line of Alaska refers to certain taxes, fees and charges imposed by governmental or quasi-governmental authorities, relating to any aspect of your tour. If governmental action results in any element of Taxes exceeding the estimates used by Gray Line of Alaska for purposes of preparing this brochure, we reserve the right to pass through the extra amount. No right of cancellation exists under these circumstances.

Tour Information: Gray Line of Alaska offers a unique opportunity for independent-minded travelers who want flexibility in their itinerary. Our tours are composed of components that can be added together to provide a truly customized package. Consequently, you will not be traveling with the same group of people, or on the same motor coach, throughout your tour. Gray Line of Alaska has a large staff of experienced representatives in Alaska. Distinguished by their red shirts or jackets, they can assist you along the way. Your motor coach driver will also serve as your guide, offering detailed information on the sights you'll see each day. As a courtesy to others onboard, no smoking is allowed on the motor coach. Frequent rest stops are scheduled for picture taking, food breaks, and stretching. On the McKinley Explorer rail cars, smoking is only allowed in the vestibule between cars. Due to the remote location and limited menus of many of the meal stops, we recommend passengers with special dietary requirements make arrangements to bring along some food to meet their special needs. Most hotels can prepare a box lunch for you if requested the day before departing.

Tour Prices Include the Following:

- Transportation and transfers, as indicated in itinerary.
- Hotel accommodations (prices based on double occupancy).
- Sightseeing, as indicated in itinerary.
- Baggage handling at hotels.

Our Standard Cancellation Protection Plan (CPP Standard) allows you, for any reason, to provide written cancellation up to 24 hours prior to commencement of travel with an 80% refund of cancellation fees. CPP is optional, must be paid at time of deposit, and is not refundable. It is an excellent value for the peace of mind it offers. In addition, Gray Line of Alaska automatically assumes an additional \$500 of liability for lost, damaged or delayed baggage of passengers who purchase CPP, subject, however, to our baggage policy. The baggage policy of Gray Line of Alaska is explained in detail in above. CPP Standard is not insurance; it provides no rights other than those explained above. For example: it does not protect double, triple, quad occupancy rates should one or more members of your party cancel, nor does it cover expenses or unused services due to trip interruption.

CPP Platinum Plan: Our Platinum Cancellation Plan (CPP Platinum Plan) enables you to supplement the CPP Standard Plan with insurance coverage and travel assistance services as well as increase your refund amount to 90% for cancellations made more than 24 hours prior to departure. The CPP Platinum Plan provides you with the following insurance benefits and services, in addition to the CPP Standard Plan benefits and larger refund:

- Trip Cancellation coverage provides protection if you or a traveling companion must cancel for a covered reason during the 24 hours prior to scheduled departure. The plan reimburses your non-refundable cancellation charges or increased occupancy charges (if a traveling companion cancels) imposed by Gray Line.
- Trip Interruption coverage provides protection if your trip is interrupted after departure due to a covered reason. The plan reimburses your unused (determined in the case of your tour on a pro rata basis), non-refundable land expenses prepaid to Gray Line of Alaska, airfare paid to return home and certain additional expenses up to \$100/day. Maximum benefit is 150% of your tour cost.
- Trip Delay coverage provides reimbursement for reasonable additional accommodations and traveling expenses incurred to rejoin the trip in progress when you are delayed for more than 12 hours, due to covered reasons. Maximum benefit is US\$1,000; not to exceed US\$100/day.
- Emergency Evacuation coverage will pay the necessary costs of transportation, medical services and medical supplies if, due to a covered medical reason, you must be transported to medical facilities during your tour. Maximum benefit is \$50,000.
- Medical Expense coverage reimburses up to \$10,000 for medical and emergency dental expenses incurred as a result of an injury or sickness that first manifests itself during your tour.

There are no pre-existing condition limitations in the CPP Platinum Plan.
