SOUTHEAST ALASKAN EXPLORER

6 Days / 5 Nights

Enjoy the best of Southeast Alaska via floatplane, ferry and dayboat cruising, including Glacier Bay National Park and Alaska's capital city, Juneau.

Day 1: Juneau

Transfer from the airport to your hotel. The afternoon and evening are free to explore Alaska's capital city. Choose optional excursions like a visit to Mendenhall Glacier or Mt. Robert's Tramway. History buffs can browse the Alaska State Museum. Gold rush fans can tour the Last Chance Museum. And for those who like to

shop, downtown Juneau is filled with colorful curio shops and art galleries. Overnight Juneau.

Day 2: Juneau – Skagway

Fly from Juneau to Skagway then it's All Aboard! You'll step back in time as you board the White Pass & Yukon Route railway for your journey along the Stampede Trail. Enjoy a fully narrated tour as you ascend the steep mountain pass to the summit and then retrace your steps as you return to Skagway. Your evening is free to stroll the wooden sidewalks and take in the sights of false-fronted buildings and beautiful natural surroundings. Overnight Skagway.

Day 3: Skagway – Haines

Relax on a ferry to Haines. Then enjoy a tour of the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve and a float trip of the local waterways in the morning. Get an up-close look at one of our nation's most recognizable symbols, the bald eagle. Overnight Haines.

Day 4: Haines – Gustavus (Glacier Bay)

This morning you will fly to Juneau then onto Gustavus and Glacier Bay Lodge, nestled among the spruce trees of Bartlett Cove. Enjoy the spectacular surroundings and optional activities at the lodge, including guided hikes and naturalist presentations. Overnight Glacier Bay. (D)

Day 5: Glacier Bay – Juneau

This morning you'll embark on a dayboat cruise through Glacier Bay National Park and Preserve, one of Alaska's most sought-after travel destinations. You will marvel at towering glaciers, home to the area's marine life. Then enjoy a flight to beautiful Juneau. Overnight Juneau. (B, L)

Day 6: Juneau

We'll transfer you to the airport, where your tour ends with many memories from the Great Land.

Day 1: Juneau – Glacier Bay Lodge

Day 2: Glacier Bay – Juneau

This morning, transfer to your dayboat for an unforgettable cruise into Glacier Bay National Park. Spend the day on the waters of Glacier Bay and see magnificent tidewater glaciers, ancient snow-capped mountains, whales, Steller sea lions, rare birds, coastal bears, seals, eagles and so much more! The only day-tour permitted inside Glacier Bay National Park, the Glacier Bay Tour takes you on a high-speed catamaran for an intimate view of marine and coastal wildlife alongside massive glaciers and towering mountains. Your journey takes you to the face of the Margerie and Grand Pacific Glaciers, two of 16 tidewater glaciers found in Glacier Bay. Your 8-hour tour is fully narrated by a National Park Service interpreter. Lunch is included. At the conclusion of your cruise, we'll transfer you to the airport in Gustavus for your return to Juneau. Tour ends at the Juneau airport. (B, L)

Day 1: Anchorage

Transfer to your downtown hotel and enjoy the rest of the day on your own. Overnight Anchorage.

Day 2: Anchorage

Tour Anchorage, including stops at the Anchorage Museum of History and Art and Lake Hood, the world's largest floatplane base. This evening, attend the Iditarod Gala known as the "Musher's Ball." Overnight Anchorage.

Day 3: Anchorage – Alyeska – Anchorage

Travel by deluxe motor coach through scenic Turnagain Arm to Alyeska Resort. While exploring this beautiful resort, choose an optional tram ride to the top of Mt. Alyeska or a superb lunch. You'll also stop at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center and Portage Glacier Lake. Overnight Anchorage.

Day 4: Anchorage

Attend the ceremonial start of the Iditarod, in downtown Anchorage and cheer on your favorite team! Overnight Anchorage.

Day 5: Anchorage

Motor coach from Anchorage to Willow for the official start of the 2010 Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race! Overnight Anchorage.

Day 6: Anchorage

Transfer to the Anchorage airport, where we'll say good-bye.

ARCTIC SIGHTSEEING

AN ADVENTURE IN NOME

Daily departures: May 25 – September 5

1- or 2-Day tours from Anchorage or Fairbanks

Nome, situated on the Seward Peninsula by the Bering Sea, is rich in colorful Gold Rush history, and is home to the world's longest dog sled race. Have your camera ready as you pull into a dog musher's camp, where you'll experience firsthand the difficulty of dog racing. During your visit to Little Creek Mine, you'll be greeted by a gold miner's family and learn about the gold strike of the 1890's. See modern day prospectors looking for the big strike and try your own luck at panning for gold—what you find, you keep. Shoppers and collectors will find exquisite jade, hand-carved ivory and skin sewings here.

ON TOP OF THE WORLD: BARROW

Daily departures: May 15 – September 16

1- or 2-Day tours from Anchorage or Fairbanks

Take flight for "the top of the world." Barrow is the northernmost point on the continent, 330 miles north of the Arctic Circle, and Alaska's largest Eskimo village. Local residents enjoy sharing their stories and culture, and you'll tour the Inupiat Heritage Center to experience local music, native dances, and the traditional blanket toss. Examine the tundra, search for bird species, see Arctic Ocean ice, and walk on a beautiful beach as far north as you may ever travel. Extra-brave guests can join the world's most prestigious Polar Bear Club with a swim in the Arctic Ocean.

Marvel at the austere beauty of this remote location on the Arctic Ocean—the source of the oil fields that feed the Trans-Alaska pipeline. Located on Alaska's North Slope and the Arctic Ocean, Prudhoe Bay is 1,300 miles south of the North Pole and 250 miles north of the Arctic Circle.

Day 1: Anchorage

Upon arrival we'll transfer you to your downtown hotel. Enjoy the rest of the day on your own. Overnight Anchorage.

Day 2: Anchorage – Prudhoe Bay

We'll transfer you to the airport this morning for your flight to Prudhoe Bay. Upon arrival, enjoy a tour of the area that surrounds the oil field facility. Overnight in Deadhorse, on the outskirts of Prudhoe Bay.

Day 3: Prudhoe Bay – Coldfoot

Travel aboard a deluxe motor coach as we venture along the Dalton Highway, also known as Haul Road, since it was the supply route for the pipeline workers during construction of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline. We'll pass Gates of the Arctic National Park, an untouched 8.3 million acres of Alaskan wilderness where populations of birds, moose, caribou and other wildlife roam free. Overnight Coldfoot.

Day 4: Coldfoot – Fairbanks

Today we'll journey to Alaska's "Golden Heart" city. Along the way we'll cross the Arctic Circle and you will be awarded an official Arctic Circle Club certificate. Look for caribou, musk ox, ptarmigan and fox. When we arrive in Fairbanks we'll transfer you to the airport or hotel.

KENAI FJORDS ADVENTURE

3 Days / 2 Nights

Experience some of Alaska's most spectacular marine wildlife in just a few days as you tour a handful of glacial waterways!

Day 1: Anchorage – Seward

This afternoon embark on a scenic journey via motor coach along the Seward Highway, an All-American Highway and Alaska Scenic Byway, that has been voted one of the Top Ten Most Scenic Drives in America by Condé Nast Traveler magazine. Tonight, enjoy your stay in picturesque Seward, a scenic coastal town of only 3,000 residents. Overnight Seward.

Day 2: Seward – Kenai Fjords National Park – Anchorage

You will start your morning with a six-hour wildlife and glacier cruise along the rugged Kenai Peninsula viewing rocky coastlines and glacier-crowned peaks. Porpoises, puffins, sea otters, whales and dozens of seabird species make their home in Kenai Fjords National Park. Enjoy lunch onboard while you're exploring the spectacular sights. After you've returned to Seward, board the Alaska Railroad. Experience the wilderness backdrop through the outdoor viewing areas, or sit back and relax on your journey to Anchorage. Overnight Anchorage. (L)

Day 3: Anchorage

We provide a transfer to the airport.

TALKEETNA DAY TOURS ROUNDTRIP ANCHORAGE BY RAIL

Approximately 12 hours. Travel from Anchorage by luxury rail to historic Talkeetna, located at the junction of three rivers, and the closest town to Mt. McKinley. Choose between three exciting excursions, then reboard the full domed railcars for your return to Anchorage.

Mt. McKinley Flightseeing (1-hour flight)

This magnificent flightseeing tour provides panoramic and close-up views of Mt. McKinley. See the Kahiltna Glacier, Climbers Base Camp, Ruth Glacier, Don Sheldon Amphitheater, and the Great Gorge. View all the peaks and glaciers on the stunning south face of Mt. McKinley.

River Rafting (2-hour rafting)

Explore the lower end of the Talkeetna River with breathtaking views of glacial moraines, boulder fields, granite canyons and sparkling hematite beaches. It is quite common to see eagles, bears, foxes, wolves, lynx, beavers and moose, as well as many species of birds and fish.

Wilderness Jet Boat Adventure (2-hour ride)

The 51-passenger *Talkeetna Queen* will whisk you into the heart of the wilderness in comfort. Upon arriving at the safari site, you'll take a quarter-mile leisurely hike. Visit an authentic trapper's cabin with its original furnishings and learn how trappers lived in "bush" Alaska at the turn of the century.

DENALI BACKCOUNTRY LODGE

3 Days / 2 Nights

Value: June 4 – 10, September 7 – 10

This package may be added to any tour that includes Denali National Park. An additional night may be required at the park entrance.

Day 1: Denali Backcountry Lodge

Start with a scenic drive from the park entrance to the end of the Denali Park Road at Denali Backcountry Lodge. You'll enjoy the sweeping vistas and variety of wildlife that make Denali National Park so famous. Nestled in the snug valley carved by Moose Creek as it winds to the Yukon, the lodge lies at the very end of the restricted 95-mile park road. Overnight Denali Backcountry Lodge. (D)

Day 2: Denali Backcountry Lodge

Begin your day exploring the pristine Alaska landscape. Relax and enjoy optional activities throughout the day, such as gold panning, mountain biking, guided hikes and a shuttle to spectacular viewing areas. On a clear day, you will capture stunning photos of majestic Mt. McKinley. Wind down the evening in the dining and lounge areas found in the spacious two-story lodge. Overnight Denali Backcountry Lodge. (B, L, D)

Day 3: Denali Park Entrance

During your journey back to the park entrance, you will have more opportunities to view wildlife in search of the Denali Big Four: moose, caribou, bear and Dall sheep. Tour ends at park entrance. (B)
